EMIGRANTS TO PENNSYLVANIA. A Consolidation of Ship Passenger Lists from "The Pennsylvania Magazine of History and Biography"

With minor exceptions these lists document arrivals at the port of Philadelphia between 1682 and 1819. They identify about 6,000 immigrants, mainly British and German, named in two extensive lists of indentured servants and apprentices.

## FEATURED BOOKS FOR JANUARY

This month we are featuring nine valuable reference books at [www.genealogical.com](http://www.genealogical.com). Here are the highlights:

When it comes to new books, two authors have produced concluding volumes in their series: (1) Terrence Punch has returned with the sequel to his extremely popular 2008

release, ERIN'S SONS: Irish Arrivals in Atlantic Canada, 1761-1853; and (2) David Dobson has compiled the concluding volume in his series on Scottish emigrants to Poland, Russia, and the Baltic states. We can also offer Native American researchers a new collection of wills and probate records for the period 1911 to 1921 by Jeff Bowen.

Reprints of classic reference books abound in January. Jeannette Austin's highly regarded three-volume set, THE GEORGIA FRONTIER, is available again at a special introductory price. Tennessee researchers can choose from Richard Carlton Fulcher's proxy 1770-1790 census of the Cumberland settlements or a collection of Revolutionary War records for the Volunteer State. Another Revolutionary-era reprint identifies German soldiers who remained in the U.S. following the war. Still other books cover 19th-century Hudson-Mohawk Valley (NY) birth, marriage, and death records and some early families of Virginia and Maryland.

The result is an exhaustive list of several thousand Scots known to have been in the Chesapeake region between 1607 and 1830, including, where known, details of birth, marriage, and death, occupation, age, date of emigration, place of settlement, and family relationships.

### FRENCH AND BRITISH LAND GRANTS in the Post Vincennes (Indiana) District, 1750-1784

The American State Papers are official government documents that were printed long before the creation of the U.S. Government Printing Office. Although these documents cover a myriad of issues (e.g., foreign affairs, commerce, etc.), for genealogists the most important categories are "Public Land" and "Claims," and it is upon these categories that this volume is based. These records range from mere lists of inhabitants to lists of claimants, land surveys, and rejected claims. In many cases we also learn the name of a spouse or other relative and a description of a lot, usually stating its proximity to the owners of other lots. Nearly 3,000 French and British pioneers are named in this work, all of whom may be found in the indexes.

### VIRGINIA HISTORICAL INDEX. In Two Volumes

This landmark work by Earl Gregg Swem was first published by the Virginia Historical Society in two volumes in 1934 and 1936. It is an index to all information relating to Virginia and Virginians in the eight most important serial publications devoted to Virginia genealogy and local history: "The Virginia Magazine of History and Biography," "The William and Mary College Quarterly," "Tyler's Quarterly Historical and Genealogical Magazine," "The William and Mary College Quarterly Historical Magazine," the "Virginia Historical Register and Literary Advertiser," the "Lower

Norfolk County Virginia Antiquary," Hening's "Statutes at Large," and the "Calendar of Virginia State Papers."

Tens of thousands of family and individual names are listed, as well as references to a wide range of subjects such as Bible records, tithables, court cases, and college rosters. The two volumes are easy to use because all entries are referenced in the same way: volume number, abbreviation of publication title, and page number. Names of individuals are printed in full, with life dates and profession and title, if known. Many cross-references to subjects are included, making the index even more comprehensive.

Both volumes have now been reprinted under the simple title, VIRGINIA MILITIA in the War of 1812. An index--entirely lacking in the original publications--has been added to each volume for the convenience of the researcher.

#### LAND CAUSES, Accomack County, Virginia, 1727-1826

These land causes, or chancery suits, for dower, division of lands, and ejectment proceedings for the period 1727 to 1826 give the declaration of the plaintiff, the answer of the defendants, the verdict of the jury, and depositions, which, in many cases, give the dates of birth, marriage, and death of the parties concerned in the suit. The records include those of the district court as well as the county court, and they name about 4,000 individuals.

## WILLS AND ADMINISTRATIONS, Accomack County, Virginia, 1663-1800

These abstracts, naming approximately 30,000 individuals, were compiled with the following objectives: to locate every record of will and administration, to obtain the names of every beneficiary of an estate, to discover the degree of relationship of the beneficiary to the testator or intestate, and to discover the nature of the inheritance. Of great importance to genealogists, special attention is paid to the orders of probate, which often contain the names of children and heirs not mentioned in the body of the will, particularly the "heir at law."
